

LISD SPECIAL OLYMPICS HISTORY 1983 – 2023

THE PERFECT STORM

A *Perfect Storm* has been described as a combination of events or things that produce an unusually powerful result. This particular storm became known as Lewisville Independent School District Special Olympics (LISDSO). It all started when in 1983 a simple jog led to the chance meeting of two young teachers and a partnership with a new graduate of The University of North Texas (UNT). *Debbie MacMullan Rath*, DeLay Middle School student teacher, and *Amelia Dye*, an Elementary teacher at nearby Central Elementary School along with *Jim Domer*, a recent UNT graduate and adapted P.E. Teacher at DeLay

Middle School, wanted something more for students with intellectual and physical disabilities. Seeing the potential in each of their students, Jim, Debbie, and Amelia solicited the help of a local parent, Janet Carson. A journey that began with compassion and determination turned dreams into reality and today's possibilities. The coming together of these powerful and enthusiastic volunteers and coaches can be described as nothing more than the Perfect Storm. A Perfect Storm that would spawn teams such as Tornadoes, Cyclones, Lightning, Tidal Wave, Thunder, Twisters, Hurricanes, Blizzards, and many more. Starting with just a few athletes in Jim Domer's Adapted Physical Education Class, LISDSO has grown from a small delegation to serving over 240 athletes in the 40 years that followed.

Let the wind beneath your wings carry you through a journey spanning forty years with hundreds of volunteers and coaches who have been the catalyst that ignited thousands of children and adults with intellectual and physical disabilities to strive to reach their personal best and fullest potential in the playing arena and in life. Together we can bring the joy of LISD Special Olympics to thousands more athletes.

- Debbie Rath and Jim Domer from DeLay Middle School, Amelia Dye from Central Elementary, and Janet Carson, parent, organized LISDSO with twenty athletes participating in Track and Field Games. Their instant friendship and love for students created a bond that would lead to forming a Special Olympics.
- Jim Domer, a recent 1983 graduate from University of North Texas (UNT), was an adapted PE Teacher, also at DeLay Middle School. He became the LISDSO coach for Track and Field. Amelia Dye, at Central Elementary School, coached both gymnastics and swimming. All coaching positions were volunteer positions.
- Debbie, Jim, and Amelia met Ann Baker, a community volunteer, and Susie Krejci, Adapted P.E. Teacher, who assisted in developing Lewisville Special Olympics Team.
- Volunteer Coaches and Teachers during the early years included Jim Domer, Amelia Dye, Debbie Rath, Diane Neff, Jimmy Odoms, Ed Beal, Bill Pietrosky, Liz Moen, Bobby and Lorraine Throckmorton, Terry and Ken Preston, Ralph Holt, Brian James, Chuck and Margo Dunaj, Terry and Sherri Bruner, Susan Boren, and many other parent and teacher volunteers, including Janet Carson who served as team nurse. Susan Boren was a teacher in the Colony. She brought the kids to DeLay Middle School after school so they could practice with the team.

July 1983 – The Sixth International Special Olympics Summer Games are held at Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. A crowd of more than 60,000 attends the opening Ceremonies and approximately 4000 athletes participate. Lewisville Special Olympics is at its birth at this time as the volunteers, teachers, and coaches encourage athletes to participate.





August 1983, Jim Domer, a 1978 graduate of Wichita Falls High School, has been named head track coach at Lewisville High School. Domer, who coached for three years at DeLay Middle School, will work with the track and cross-country programs of the Farmers. He is the son of Charlese Hearn of Wichita Falls and Tom Domer of Houston. Domer has been instrumental in helping to establish the Special Olympics team in Lewisville, Texas.

- LISDSO competed in area tournaments held at Loos Stadium in Dallas. Twenty LISDSO athletes qualified for the state tournament in track and field; five LISDSO gymnasts qualified for the state tournament. - Susie Krejci, Adapted Physical Education Teacher at DeLay Middle School, continues building LISDSO with the efforts of Ann Baker, a local resident, and the support of LISD Administrators Jan Bennett and Clint Mosely. Krejci uses knowledge gained from Princeton Special Olympics Program to strengthen LISDSO.
- Operating funds were low, so the teachers held their first fund raiser by creating posters with various themes.
- Ann Baker's employer donates \$2500 while donations began to come in as local developers and merchants donated \$2500 and SEPTA contributed \$500.

- Sports were Track and Field and Gymnastics involving thirty-two athletes, five parents, and five teachers.
- Participated in the State Track and Field Tournament in Austin involving twelve athletes, two parents, and three teachers.
- Susie Krejci, Jim Domer, Amelia Dye, Ann Baker, Susan Boren, and Debbie Rath coordinated programs throughout the year.

June 1985 – The Law Enforcement Torch Run in Texas begins, when a small group of Houston police officers carries a Special Olympics torch

to the Houston city limits and gives it to a group from the Bexar County Mounted Patrol. The county officers on horseback carried the torch to Austin to help open the 1985 Summer Games.





- LISDSO changed to Area 10 State Classification to take advantage of better programming and paid Special Olympics Staff. Bill Pietrosky became the first District Coordinator for LISD Special Olympics. As an LISD PE Instructor at DeLay Middle School, he was granted a stipend to be District Coordinator. Bill Petroski coached Basketball.
- Members of the LISDSO team brought back bronze, silver, and gold medals from the State Special Olympics Track and Field meet in Austin.

These programs put athletes in an environment where people listen to them and value them as individuals. 












